26/00753/PNT56 Allerton Park Caravan Park: The proposed works comprise the removal of existing 20m lattice tower supporting 6 no. antennas and the installation of a new 25m lattice tower supporting 6 no. antennas, 2 no. 300mm transmission dish and ancillary development there to including 15 no Ericsson Radio Systems. Allerton Park, Allerton Mauleverer, Knaresborough North Yorkshire HG5 0SE

Thank you for consulting The Gardens Trust (GT) in its role as Statutory Consultee with regard to proposed development affecting Allerton Park, a site included by Historic England (HE) on their Register of Parks & Gardens, (RPG), as per the above application, at grade II. (List Entry Number 1000402). The Yorkshire Gardens Trust (YGT) is a member organisation of the GT and works in partnership with it in respect of the protection and conservation of registered sites and is authorised by the GT to respond on GT's behalf in respect of such consultations.

The proposed works are within Coronation Plantation in the southern area of the RPG just north of A59. The increased height will make the structure well visible above the tree canopy and from a fairly wide area including Allerton Castle (Listed Grade I) and probably the Temple of Victory (Listed Grade II*). The Temple of Victory sits on a knoll in the Near Park from where there are extensive views over the parkland and the surrounding countryside. The additional dishes as well as the antennae will add to the visibility. We would have expected elevations to be included in the application as they normally are, comparing the existing situation with the proposed.

From the documentation submitted, the Gardens Trust and Yorkshire Gardens Trust consider that the application would result in less than substantial harm to the RPG, but as we have not made a site visit, we recommend that advice is sought from your Authority's Conservation Officer.
